Speakers

Mr. John Sullivan -Director of Legislative Affairs

The legislation season has commenced in Tallahassee. The first three weeks have been pre-conference meetings. Senate Bill 48 combines the voucher programs and funds from Florida Education. There is an increase in voucher eligibility. This is a concern because this is the same source public schools are funded from and will have a negative impact on our budgets/future funding. Dollars are potentially diverted to private and charter school which are not held to the same

accountability standards. The opinion of the district is that all receiving funding from taxpayers should be held to the same accountability standards.

The governor's recommended budget requests more money for education, however, may be limited by reduction in state revenue due to COVID. The requested increase by the governor is \$232 per student.

There are also proposals to suspend penalties via the accountability system. (SB 886) This committee will begin early March and updates will be provided.

Mr. Tom Albano -Coordinator Equity and Diversity

There are several initiatives within the department focused on equity and diversity. Mr. Hickman is the chief of the department and Mr. Watkins is the director. Workshops and professional development are provided to school personnel (teachers and leaders) to close the achievement gap and shift perspective. The department seeks to create awareness and an atmosphere of equity, diversity, and inclusion in all schools and departments in BCPS. This relates directly to race, ethnicity, gender, disability, and language. There is a goal of decreasing students in alternative education programs by providing Tier 1 academic and behavioral interventions. This includes making all classrooms throughout the district responsive to the students we serve and the required instruction by statute 1003.42.

Mr. Richie Baum - Director of Student Assessment and Research

The will be possible schedule revisions and additional flexibility are being discussed at FDOE. Any changes to the spring schedule will require an Emergency Order because requirements are statutory. Policy 6000.1 Carolyn Krohn presenter

The student progression plan is available on the school board website. It houses the promotion criteria for each grade. The policy is updated annually. A recent update includes the make up policy. The document is arranged by school level (elementary/middle/high). DAC and the areas are part of the Policy 6000.1 committee that meets monthly. This month's discussions include changes to interim reports that would require all grade levels to indicate a drop of two letter grades for grades 3-5. This is currently only in effect for grades 6-12. This and other recommendations will be discussed further at the area meetings for input.
